Sadly there has been something of a setback this year.

However, compared with 30 years ago when PolioPlus started, the present situation is a tribute to the great work of Rotary and its partners in fighting this insidious disease. Ten cases of polio have been reported this calendar year (eight in Afghanistan, two in Pakistan), compared with five for the same period last year. And there are rumours that cases have now been found in Venezuela. Nevertheless, the need for continuing financial support from clubs remains a priority.

The DDF match incentive program was launched to encourage club giving for polio, with some success but less than hoped for. The situation was greatly assisted by the innovative Star Carnivale event staged by RC Albert Park. Sales of Rotary water bottles and District ties/scarfs have also assisted fund raising for polio eradication within District 9800.

Breaking News: It is intended to extend the End Polio Challenge program into the next Rotary year under the same terms as this year and hopefully over 2018-2019 there will be more opportunities for Clubs / Clusters to raise additional funds to contribute towards ending Polio. Making a Difference: as an incentive the district match will be doubled for this year. This will result in DDF contributions up to the maximum of A\$50,000 that was set as the challenge amount. This means each dollar that was raised through a special effort will translate into \$15 to fight polio. Club giving will translate to \$7.50 for each dollar contributed.

Thank you to all of the clubs and individuals who have joined the fight so far.

And on the subject of polio:

congratulations to **PDG Ian Knight OAM**, who was the recipient of the prestigious PolioPlus Pioneer Award in recognition of his outstanding contribution in his year as District Governor in 1987-88, which was the start of the PolioPlus program. Ian was one of only 39 recipients of this award worldwide. In our next issue we will provide more details about this award, but more importantly, the achievements in 1987-88 towards eradicating this insidious disease.

What can you and your club do to End Polio??

One of the many successful fund raisers held last Rotary year to raise funds and rise to the **Challenge** was a "booked out" movie night organised by the members of the e-Club at the Yarraville cinema.
